Important Reminders (apologies there are a few)!

Now for a little housekeeping! As always, please make sure that ALL school uniform and property is clearly named. There was a huge amount of lost property at the end of last term. Please do remember that if you buy secondhand uniform from the FOS, this will need renaming. Sometimes it is very tricky to work out which child is the rightful owner! Thank you.

Whilst thinking about uniform please ensure children have the correct PE kit in school each day. Black/blue shorts, plain white T-shirt or blue school sports top, blue/black joggers and blue jumper for outdoors for inclement weather.

Please also remember that **no jewellery**, **including earrings**, nail varnish or other make – up can be worn at school by any child. Novelty head bands and hair accessories are also not permitted (including large bows, things with ears etc). Small simple headbands in either school colours or black or brown only please. Thank you for your support with this.

Water bottles – all children should bring a refillable water bottle to school every day. They must contain water only – no juice.

Packed lunches- please ensure if your child has a packed lunch, they contain a balanced healthy meal. Children should not bring sweets or chocolate bars.

Please adhere to our **NO NUTS** in school policy! We have children and staff with severe nut allergies!

Please, as always, if bringing children to school by car, park safely and with due consideration to our neighbours!

Finally, please ensure that you do not drive on to the school site at any time without prior permission from Mrs Cook. This includes drop off and collection times for The Lime Trees.

Attendance

I know it's difficult some mornings however, please ensure your child is on time to school it does make a big difference to the start of the day. If they are 10 minutes late, we have been told to put this down as an absence. Please note that we are not able to authorise holidays unless there are exceptional circumstances for the absence. We appreciate holidays are a lot cheaper in school time, but we aim for an attendance of 97% and taking a holiday in school time really can have a detrimental effect for your child on their attendance figures and education.

This newsletter, along with all other letters including class newsletters and dates will all be on our website. We will always try to give as much notice as possible for any upcoming events. However, please could we ask for your understanding where we haven't been able to send communications as far in advance

as we would like - this is often due to circumstances out of our control.
