Everyone needs to take care when crossing the road. There are a few rules we can use to help keep us safe.

1. **Find** a safe place to cross

Holding hands helps to keep us safe. If your adult is holding things in their hands or pushing a pushchair or wheelchair, what could you hold instead?



2. **Stop** with your feet at the edge of the kerb



## STOP LOOK & LISTEN

Draw around your hand on a piece of paper. Carefully cut it out (ask an adult to help). Write a word on each finger that will help you cross the road safely. - 1) First find a safe place to cross
- 2) Stop just before the kerb
- 3) Look all around for traffic and listen
- 4) Let any moving vehicles pass
- 5) Walk straight across to the other side
- 6) Do not run
- 7) Keep looking and listening as you cross
- 8) Think!
