

Please read or share a book with your child three times a week. Record each session in their reading diary to help their monkey climb the reading tree and earn a certificate!	Celebrating with light Why do we celebrate bonfire night? Can you retell the story of Guy Fawkes, possibly in words or maybe with your toys? An adult could film you and put it on tapestry. (Week 2)	Celebrating with light Can you make a firework masterpiece? This could be with crayons, chalk in the garden, laying out materials on the floor to create a big creation. Don't forget to take a photo! (Week 2)	Go on an autumnal walk. What do you notice? What has changed? What colours can you see? What can't you see anymore?
Practice putting on gloves independently. Finding the right holes can be tricky and needs practice before the winter months, so your child can do it themselves for playtime. Practice counting everyday objects up to 10. What if there was one more? What if there was one less? Can you count forwards? Can you count backwards?	Can you make a model space rocket? You could use Lego, building blocks, large cardboard boxes or small box modelling. Don't forget to take a photo and put it on tapestry. (Week 3 & 4)
Practice running, hopping, jumping and balancing. You could think of your own game to play with your own rules that involve these skills. How many hops can you do in 1 min? How long can you hold a balance for?	Practice tricky red words using flashcards. Try jumping toys onto the words, running to the correct one when called, or pulling a word from a mystery bag to read aloud!	What interesting facts can you find out about arctic animals? Can you find any facts in books or online? You could record using pictures, words or videos. (week 6)	Practice forming letters in the correct direction and starting position. Could you: finger formation in a tray of rice, writing with fun pens, forming letters with a paintbrush and water on the patio.
