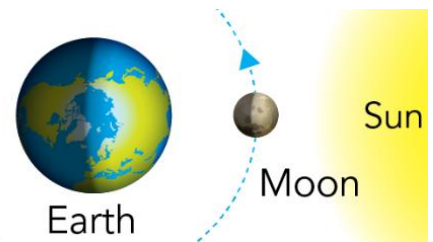

Tim Peake	Tim Peake is a British astronaut who travelled to space. He did important experiments to help scientists learn more about space and how it affects the human body.
Bonfire Night	Bonfire Night is a British celebration that takes place every year on 5th November. It marks the Gunpowder Plot of 1605, when Guy Fawkes and his group tried to blow up the Houses of Parliament.	Katherine Johnson	A talented American mathematician who worked for NASA.
Guy Fawkes	The main man involved in a plot to blow up the Houses of Parliament.	woodland creatures	Animals found in UK woodlands including: fox, badger, squirrel, owl, rabbit, deer and hedgehogs.
Celebration	A joyful gathering often marked with decorations, food and gifts.	Autumn	The season after summer and before winter. We often see leaves turning orange and falling to the ground.
Sun	The star in the centre of our solar system. Earth rotates around it.	Arctic creatures	Animals found in the arctic circle (north pole) including polar bear, fox, hare, reindeer, walrus and orcas.
Earth	The planet where we live.	Christmas	The annual Christian celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ.
solar system	A collection of planets and moons that orbit the sun.	The Christmas story	The biblical story of Mary and Joseph travelling to Bethlehem to give birth to the son of God.
