British Empire was powerful under the monarch , Queen Victoria. In Britain, many lived in poverty; rights & roles in society were different to today. Many inventions, including railways and factory machines changed life.
How did the Victorians affect schooling?	Many children worked, particularly in an agricultural community. The National School 1850; Old School (1876); From 1870, school started to be compulsory . Victorian classes were large with focus on 3Rs & harsh punishments.
How did schools change after the Victorians?	Old school used until our school was built in 1961. Record of interview with local resident to identify changes over time.
How did industrialisation change the village?	Population of CB in 1800 = 300 people, mainly working in agriculture. 1797 Nott'm to Grantham canal opened transporting coal, gypsum and night soil. Later used for transporting bricks . 1850 Grantham to Nott'm railway opened. CB population was ~ 600. Canal closed in 1936. Many new houses built with more planned. Now ~2 000 people live in CB but many work outside the village thanks to transport links.


